



TRAVELLING WITH *LIQUIDS, AEROSOLS AND GELS* AS HAND LUGGAGE

At European airports, only certain *liquids, aerosols and gels* may be carried as hand luggage. These must be presented at security.

The rules below apply to all liquids, gels, aerosols, pastes, lotions, foams, creams, jams, liquid/solid mixtures and other items of similar consistency.

YOU CAN TAKE :



Liquids in containers of 100ml or less packed in a single, transparent, re-sealable 1-litre plastic bag



Medicines and special dietary products, e.g. food for children, vital for the trip, will be screened by the security officers



Duty free in a sealed security bag

- ✓ Duty free liquids and receipts purchased from any airport or airline, sealed at the time of purchase inside a security bag (STEB) with a red border, may need to be screened by the security officers
- ✓ The security bag must remain sealed until the final destination

YOU CANNOT TAKE:



All other liquids, aerosols and gels (LAGs) cannot be taken as hand luggage

Please place them in your checked (hold) luggage, unless noted otherwise by Carriers



- ⦿ **Present your *liquids, aerosols and gels* separately** from other hand luggage for screening at security
- ⦿ Security may require bottles or containers to be opened for screening
